Community Schools Update, Ted Chisholm

- We are getting quotes from Olson Electric to repair the pull stations and one fire alarm sensor in the greenhouse as rain coming in from the Roof Louvre has caused problems, which means we will be accessing our 'GH Capital Sustainability Fund' that the PAC has put some funds toward.
- Ellen has been attending the Growing Green monthly meetings, and our plan is to sell some Greenhouse starts at the Spring Harvest Celebration. She is going to arrange for some parents to assist and there is a need to clarify with the PAC how we do this going forward. DBES PAC has generously supported and contributed to the greenhouse over the past 4 years, and it would be good to find a balance for what you feel is fair. Should proceeds from sales go to the PAC to reimburse for what you provide at the beginning of the year? Would PAC want to do a revenue split?
- I am working on a model to build towards some sustainability, which involves some benefit to Grace, (or future key volunteer who takes her place).
- As the CS has limited funding to support her time, having her benefit from what is grown and sold as a fundraiser since she is doing most of it seems fair. Having some proceeds going to build a contingency fund is necessary. As PAC members are likely going to be involved in some of the initiatives, I would like to have a conversation to discuss what would be fair for you.

DPAC Update, Jana Curll

- Alun Woolliams Trac Director presented 'Connect the Coast', a movement for an multiuser path from Langdale to Sechelt as an alternative to the single vehicle highway. (Bikes, walking etc.) Studies and recommendations are underway for the proposed path to run parallel to the hwy. The first parts would be Langdale to Gibsons, DPAC voted unanimously to write a letter of support for the project.
- Colten Rockford SD46 student presented proposed Free transit for all students (inclusion of secondary and post-secondary). DPAC voted unanimously to write a letter of support for the initiative.
- DPAC Chair report:
 - BC Cancer is asking schools to join Sun Sense. Schools will be given resources to provide UV protection.
 - BCCPAC nominations are open for the board of directors. DPAC has the funds to send up to 2 people in May.
 - The DPAC gaming grant is now tentatively spent so Foodsafe compensation is closed for now. Funding may be reopened in the fall.
